In January, 2019, UGC granted Autonomy to 68 colleges of Maharashtra, HJ College being one of them. Autonomy has empowered the college to academic freedom to frame its own curriculum, evaluate students and start its own value based courses, which it shall do in the academic year 2019-20. ## Session I (10:00am to 11:30 am)-. Introduction to Human Rights

The first spokesperson of the training program was Mr. M A Sayeed – Acting Chairperson & Member, Maharashtra State Human Rights Commission (MSHRC).

MrSayeed mainly deliberated on constitutional provisions, universal declaration of Human Rights and International Covenants regarding Human Rights.

Session II (11:30am to 1:00pm) – Rights of Women and Children was conducted by Adv. Dr. Rashmi Oza – Professor and Dean, Interdisciplinary Studies, Department of Law, University of Mumbai.

Dr. Rashmi Oza deliberated on UN Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, UN convention on the Rights of the Child and Child Labour issues regarding Human Rights.

Session III (1:45 pm to 3:15 pm) – Human Rights Institutions in India, was conducted by Mr. Mafiul Hussain – Former Secretary, Maharashtra State Human Rights Commission, Mumbai.

Mr. Mafiul deliberated on Protection of Human Rights, composition and functioning of NHRC/SHRC and other National and State Commissions

Session IV (3:15 pm to 4:45 pm) – Rights of Other Vulnerable Groups was conducted by Adv. Puneet Chaturvedi – Practicing Lawyer, High Court and Supreme Court, Mumbai.

Advocate Chaturvedi deliberated on the issues of Schedule caste and tribes, bonded labour and abolition and most importantly role of stakeholders in creating awareness and setting up of Human Rights cell in Educational institutions.

All the sessions had a common theme – the role of educators in spreading awareness about human rights. Each speaker provided insights on their respective topics through their relevant practical experiences.

## Hansraj Jivandas College of Education receives Autonomy

Since HJ college had scored more than 3.51 during its last re accreditation by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), it became eligible for autonomy without undergoing scrutiny by various UGC committees. Thus after applying for it, the college was awarded the Autonomous status in the month of January, 2019.

From the coming academic year 2019-20, the college can introduce its own curriculum and assessment method and also seek grant from Rashtriya Uchchatar (RUSA) — a funding agency under the Centre.

While its affiliation continues with Mumbai University, it will be able to implement academic freedom in the form of changes in its curriculum, ways of assessment and also introduce value based courses. By encouraging Autonomy RUSA wants to create islands of excellence all over the nation.

# <u>Digital Launch by Prime Minister Modiji of the Entrepreneurship Cell and Skill Hub</u> <u>Project at HJ College</u>

The college was part of the Digital Launch of the Entrepreneurship Cell and Skill Hub Project, under Component 8 of Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). RUSA is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) under the aegis of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. It was launched in 2013 to usher transformative reforms in the State Higher Education System by creating a facilitating institutional structure for planning and monitoring at the state level, promoting autonomy in State Universities and improving governance in institutions.

The Digital Launch held at the college on 3 February 2019, was a national event which aimed to change the scenario in higher education. It included the inauguration of 70 Model Degree Colleges, 11 Professional Colleges, 66 Entrepreneurship Innovation & Career Hubs, and 1 Women's University.
